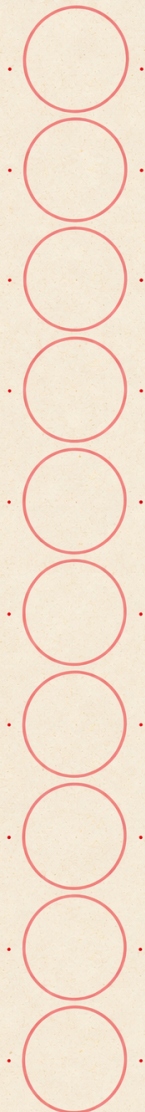

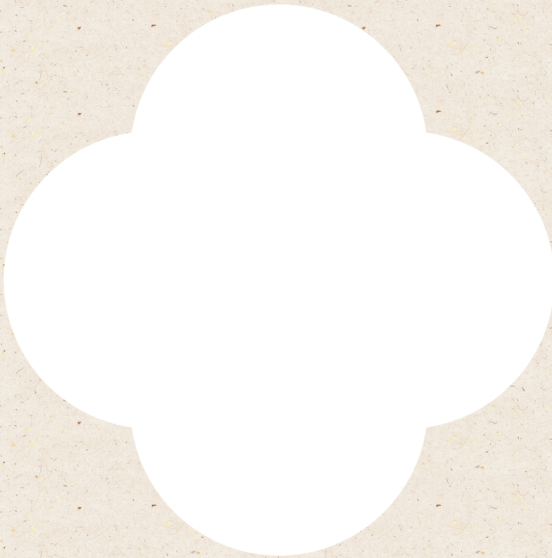

Lion Dance & Stage Performances

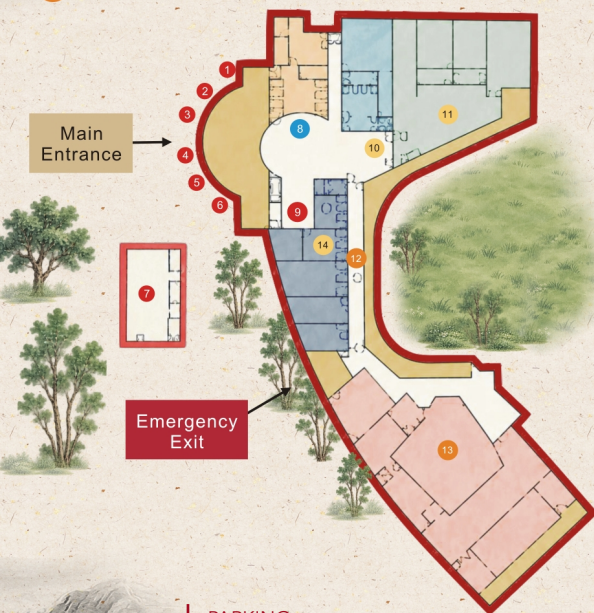

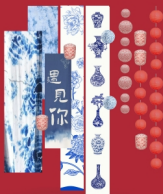

Try traditional Chinese woodblock printing! Choose a carved block, apply ink, and create your own print while exploring one of China's oldest printing traditions.



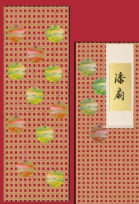
青花瓷拼贴画 | Blue & White Porcelain Collage

Pick up a brush and try Chinese calligraphy. Learn how simple brushstrokes come together to create expressive and beautiful Chinese characters.



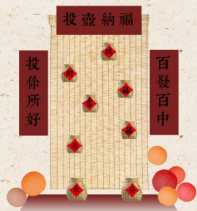
漆扇 | Lacquer Fan Art

The Genealogy Center beside the Carver Museum began as Austin's first public library in 1926, was later moved to East Austin, and became an important cultural landmark in the community.



10 African Bracelet Making



Step into a joyful, hands-on circle where stories meet beads. Guided by Lola Bean Bracelets, you'll explore color, pattern, and meaning—drawing inspiration from symbols and motifs across the continent. Choose your palette, learn the language of design, and craft a bracelet that carries your intention. It's beginner-friendly, reflective, and fun. Take your seat, lean in, bead your story— and leave with a keepsake you'll love to wear again and again.

14 African Storytelling

Gather close—our circle is forming. One storyteller. A thousand echoes: Queen Dexxi invites us into an afternoon of wisdom, humor, and heart. With each tale, she turns listeners into participants—with call-and-response moments, knowing nods, and laughter that feels like home. In her voice, proverbs walk, ancestors sing, and tomorrow listens. Queen Dexxi opens her basket of stories—laughter stitched to wisdom—until the room itself becomes a song of belonging and a gentle drum you can hear with your heart. All are welcome—come for the laughter in the aisles, the hush you can feel, and a story or two that insists on traveling home with you.



About the Festival

Inspired by the theme “Community Engagement Through Chinese Traditional Dance, Music, Folk Arts, and Heritage Education,” the 2026 Moonflower Multicultural Heritage Festival brings cultural heritage to life through traditional dance and music, hands-on folk arts, cultural demonstrations, food, and educational experiences.

More than a celebration of Chinese heritage, the festival creates a space for cross-cultural learning and community connection. By bringing Chinese and Asian traditions together with African American and other cultural voices at the historic Carver Museum, the festival invites visitors to discover the stories, traditions, and experiences that shape our communities—and to celebrate the cultural diversity that is part of Austin’s shared heritage.

Why We Gather Here

The Carver Museum reminds us of the importance of preserving history, sharing community stories, and passing cultural heritage from one generation to the next. By gathering here, we celebrate Chinese and Asian traditions while connecting with African American and other cultural traditions that together enrich Austin’s diverse cultural landscape.



George Washington Carver Museum, Cultural and Genealogy Center

The **George Washington Carver Museum, Cultural and**



Genealogy Center is an important part of Austin's African American cultural heritage. Its history traces back to Austin's first public library, built in 1926 and relocated to East Austin in 1933, where it became the city's first branch library serving

communities of color. The historic building later became home to Texas's first African American neighborhood museum.

Today, the Carver Museum preserves and celebrates African American history, culture, and art through exhibitions, performances, educational programs, and community experiences. Visitors are encouraged to explore the museum's galleries and discover the stories and cultural legacy of the surrounding community.

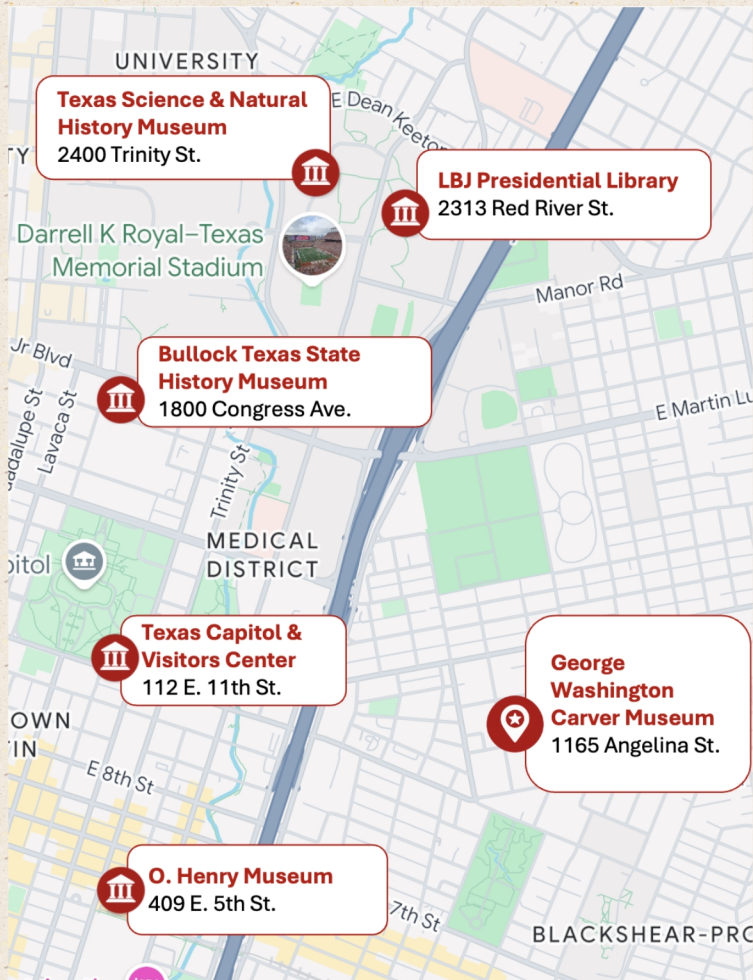
The **Genealogy Center**

extends this mission through family history and ancestry.
